Important Updates All Employers Need to Know:

New Workplace Violence Prevention Law and Private Attorneys General Act Reform: Key Changes for California Employers

Workplace Violence Protection Law

California has enacted Senate Bill 553, introducing new workplace violence prevention requirements effective July 1, 2024. Applicable to nearly all employers in the state, these regulations are enforced by the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA).

Key Obligations for Employers:

- Develop and implement a Workplace Violence Prevention Plan (WVPP)
- Train employees on the WVPP
- Identify, evaluate, and correct workplace violence hazards
- Maintain workplace violence incident logs and adhere to recordkeeping requirements

Coverage: All California employers are covered except:

- Health care workers under Cal/OSHA's specific standard
- · California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation
- Remote employees not under employer control
- Employers with fewer than 10 employees and no public access
- Law enforcement agencies

Definition and Types of Workplace Violence: Workplace violence includes any act or threat of physical force likely to result in injury, psychological trauma, or stress. It is categorized into:

- Type 1: Violence by individuals with no legitimate business at the worksite
- Type 2: Violence by customers, clients, patients, etc.
- Type 3: Violence by a current or former employee
- Type 4: Violence by someone with a personal relationship with an employee

Workplace Violence Prevention Plan (WVPP): Employers must establish and maintain a WVPP, either standalone or as part of the Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP). The plan must include:

- Individuals responsible for implementation
- Procedures for employee involvement in hazard identification and plan implementation
- · Coordination with other employers
- · Procedures for reporting and responding to incidents
- · Training and communication protocols
- · Emergency response and post-incident procedures
- · Regular plan review and revision

Training Requirements: Employers must provide effective training on the WVPP, tailored to employees' literacy and language needs. Training must cover:

- The WVPP and how to access it
- · Reporting incidents without fear of reprisal
- Specific workplace violence hazards and preventive measures
- · Incident log maintenance and access to training records

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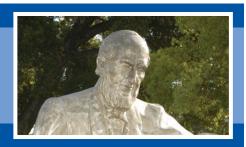

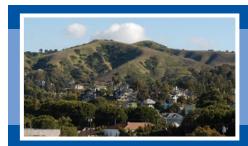

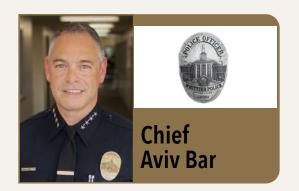








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Vacation without a Burglary at Home

- Lock doors, windows, side gates, garage door and garage side access door.

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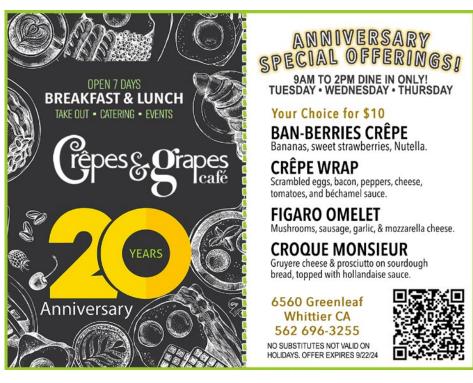
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Your Medicare Shop Around the Corner Part D appeals

Every so often we will have a Medicare Beneficiary come into our Medicare Resource Center lamenting about their Part D plan not covering a medication they need. Ninety-nine percent of the time, we help them get a favorable resolution for their concern.

Here are some of the steps we take and resources we use:

- 1. Reach Out to Your Part D Plan: Begin by calling the customer service number listed on your Part D plan card. The representatives can provide specific reasons why your medication was denied, such as it not being on the formulary, needing prior authorization, or requiring step therapy. Understanding the exact reason for the denial is crucial as it helps you tailor your appeal appropriately. The customer service team can also guide you through the process of filing an appeal or an exception request and may provide forms and instructions.
- 2. Consult Your Prescribing Provider: Have a detailed discussion with your doctor about the denial. Your healthcare provider can offer valuable insights into alternative medications that are covered by your plan and could work for your condition. If switching medications is not a viable option due to medical reasons, your doctor can assist you in the appeals process by providing the necessary medical documentation and a letter of support. This letter should explain why the prescribed medication is essential for your treatment, addressing the specific reasons for the plan's denial.
- **3. Medicare.Gov:** Access the official Medicare website for comprehensive information on the appeals process, filing grievances, and details about Part D coverage. The website offers a wealth of resources, including step-by-step guides, forms, and frequently asked questions that can help you understand your rights and the proper procedures. The site also provides links to additional support services and tools to compare Part D plans during AEP (Annual Election Period) October 15 December 7th.
- **4. State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)**: SHIP offers free, unbiased counseling on Medicare issues, including appeals and grievances. SHIP counselors are trained to help you navigate the complexities of Medicare Part D. They can explain your rights, assist with paperwork, and provide advice on how to present your case effectively. You can find your local SHIP contact information on the Medicare website. SHIP counselors can also help you explore alternative options and ensure that you understand the implications of different choices.
- 5. Medicare Rights Center: This national nonprofit organization provides expert counseling and advocacy for Medicare beneficiaries. The Medicare

Rights Center offers personalized assistance through its helpline and educational resources. They can help you understand the appeals process, provide guidance on how to write an effective appeal, and offer strategic advice. Their support can be particularly valuable if you face complicated issues or need to escalate your appeal through multiple levels.

- **6. Legal Help:** If you encounter complex issues or require additional assistance navigating the appeals process, consider seeking legal advice. Many areas have legal aid organizations that offer free services to eligible individuals. Legal professionals can provide specialized help in preparing your appeal, ensuring that all regulatory requirements are met, and that your case is thoroughly documented. Legal assistance can significantly enhance your chances of a favorable outcome, especially if your case involves intricate medical or regulatory details.
- **7. Keep Documentation:** It is crucial to save all correspondence and notices from your Part D plan. This includes the initial denial notice, any communication regarding the appeals process, and all related documentation such as medical records and letters of support from your doctor. Organizing these documents can help you track important deadlines and provide comprehensive evidence during your appeal. Documentation is also essential if you need to escalate your appeal to higher levels, as it demonstrates a clear and consistent record of your efforts and the plan's responses.

By utilizing these resources and following the steps outlined, you can effectively navigate the appeals process and seek coverage for the medication you need. Understanding your rights and being proactive in gathering information and support will improve your chances of a successful appeal.

Remember that persistence is key; if your initial appeal is denied, you have the right to escalate your case to higher levels of review. Each level of appeal offers another opportunity to present your case and potentially secure the coverage you need.

Identifying and Responding to Hazards: Employers must conduct regular inspections to identify workplace violence hazards and involve employees in this process. Corrective actions must be taken for identified hazards, and additional training provided as needed.

Documentation: Employers must maintain:

- · Training records for one year
- Violent incident logs, hazard identification, evaluation, and correction records, and incident investigation records for five years

Resources: CalChamber offers a Workplace Violence Prevention Toolkit to assist employers in compliance. It includes templates, checklists, and a webinar for practical guidance.

Private Attorneys General Act

Changes to PAGA:

An Overview for California Employers

On July 1, Governor Gavin Newsom signed two bills reforming aspects of the Private Attorneys General Act (PAGA), with changes effective retroactively to June 19.

What Do the New Changes Include?

Penalty Caps: The maximum penalties employers face under PAGA could now be reduced to as little as 15% or 30% of the original amount, depending on proactive steps taken by the employer before or immediately after receiving a PAGA notice.

More Robust Right to Cure: Previously, PAGA allowed very few curable violations. The new reforms provide more opportunities for employers to correct violations.

Specific Mechanisms for Different Businesses: The reforms introduce tailored mechanisms depending on whether the business is large or small.

Changes in Standing: Recent court opinions had allowed workers to sue on behalf of all other employees in California for any Labor Code violation if they experienced just one violation themselves. The reforms now require plaintiffs to have personally experienced the alleged violations and to file their case within one year.

Nonprofit Exception: There is a narrow exception now for some nonprofits.

Steps to Limit Exposure

The reforms include significant penalty reductions if employers have taken reasonable steps to comply with the law. Such steps include:

- Conducting Payroll Audits: Employers should perform regular audits and act on the findings. For example, addressing common violations such as unpaid overtime, meal and rest break violations, or expense reimbursements.
- Written Policies: Implement and enforce written policies related to wage and hour practices.
- Industry-Specific Wage Orders: Ensure company policies comply with relevant industry-specific wage orders.
- Provide Training: Train supervisors and managers on Labor Code requirements and basic wage and hour rules.

- Corrective Action: Address issues with supervisors or personnel involved in wage and hour violations through coaching, additional training, or disciplinary action if necessary.
- Documentation: Keep records of efforts made to comply with the steps above.

These changes aim to make PAGA more equitable for employers while maintaining protections for employees.

Playing Google's Game

search engine optimization (SEO) and how to design sure you rank as high as possible in the search results. How your site is built and

designed is certainly important, both to Google's algorithm and the actual people who visit. It needs to be part of the plan but should not be the entire plan.

Instead of thinking in terms of web design as everything, think of it as part of a larger strategy for managing your digital footprint. That's how Google looks at it, and whether you like it or not, Google still sets the rules of the game.

One aspect of your digital footprint that may have been overlooked is your Google Business Profile. It is a free tool that helps you bring location, reviews, photos and relevant information about your business to one place. It usually appears in the upper right part of your browser, next to the list of search results. Make sure it is properly linked to your site. It needs to be kept current and regularly updated, especially with pictures.

A second aspect is review management. It might not seem particularly impactful, but cultivating and responding to reviews is an important part of your digital footprint. At least Google thinks it is. Responding to reviews, both positive and negative, sits well with the algorithm. More importantly,

There's lots of it's part of authentically engaging with your discussion about clientele. You wouldn't simply walk away if someone told you how much they enjoyed their experience with your business, would you? When you fail to respond to a review, your website to make that's what you are doing. If you get a negative review, the best thing you can do is reply with a genuine response. If the reviewer feels like you owe them an apology, give them one that is sincere and offer to make the situation right. Most of the time, people just want to feel like they are being heard and that your business

There's one last thing to consider about your website. Think of it as the place you live online. It's your house and you want to own it. While it can be tempting to substitute a social media profile for a website, remember you don't own that profile. It is owned by the social media platform, along with everything you post. The rules can change without notice and one day you might find that your message that used to reach hundreds of thousands or even millions of followers is now only reaching thousands. If you use social media to drive people to your site, they will always have a place to visit to get the important updates and information they need.

It's easy to get lost in all the technical aspects of managing your digital footprint. Remember that ultimately, everything you are doing is to have more and better interactions with real people. Business is not a website or online profile. Those are simply tools to help people understand how your business can make their lives better.

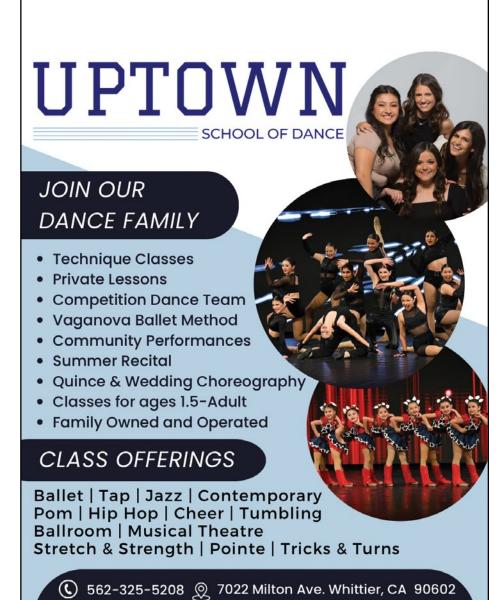

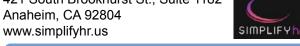

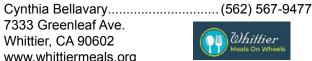
