It Is Imperative We Support The Greenleaf Promenade Project

Uptown Whittier is a cherished jewel of Greenleaf Promenade project. the city that has long awaited revival. Plans for revitalization have surfaced many times over the past three decades, yet tangible progress has not been realized. However, amid these challenges, the Greenleaf Promenade project has emerged as a generational opportunity, representing a significant commitment to breathe new life into the area.

In 1987, Whittier faced a formidable trial when a powerful earthquake struck, causing widespread destruction amounting to an estimated \$100 million. At that time, City leaders pledged to rebuild and revitalize Uptown Whittier in response, setting the stage for subsequent efforts.

Despite these many attempts, the execution of revitalization plans stumbled over the years. The unveiling of the Uptown Specific Plan in the early 1990s was a key moment but failed to translate into substantial progress. Subsequent strategic planning in 2008 outlined ambitious goals, including housing units and commercial space construction, but faced significant challenges and delays. Parking infrastructure, critical to revitalization efforts, encountered numerous hurdles over the years, reflecting the challenges impeding progress. However, in December 2023, the Whittier City Council voted to allocate \$20 million to the revitalization of Uptown Whittier, marking the inception of the www.reviveuptown.com has been

The Greenleaf Promenade project holds immense promise for Uptown Whittier's future. Beyond token fixtures and limited urban renewal, it aims to stimulate the economy, elevate property values, and instill civic pride in our community. By creating vibrant public spaces and enhancing walkways, it will attract residents, businesses, and visitors, revitalizing the district — a result long overdue. The project will benefit everyone, including the businesses and building owners many of whom are Whittierites; lifelong and those who came here to make it home.

towards However, the journey revitalization comes with serious challenges. Special interest groups continue to impede progress, hindering efforts to address the genuine needs of the community. Despite these obstacles, the Greenleaf Promenade represents a rare opportunity to realize the longawaited revitalization of Uptown Whittier. We must seize this opportunity now!

Three groups within the city are united in this effort — Uptown Whittier Improvement Association, Whittier Uptown Association, and Whittier Chamber of Commerce — to drive this project forward and transform Uptown for future generations. 

Thanks to all of you who voted in the General Municipal election last month. I appreciate the opportunity to serve our wonderful community for another term as Mayor and help ensure that Whittier remains a great place to LIVE, WORK, and SHOP for today and future generations. No matter how big or small a decision may be, my objective remains the same: what is best for the people of Whittier. I am focused on making Whittier the best place in Southern California to raise a family (and grandkids too!). I'm honored and humbled to help guide our city forward and continue building on the progress we've made in recent years.

Congratulations are in order for Cathy Warner on her re-election and serving as Mayor Pro Tem representing Council District 3. I also want to welcome our newest City Council member, Mary Ann Pacheco, representing Council District 1. Mary Ann is a great addition to the City Council with a history of educational leadership at Rio Hondo College and community service as a board member for many local organizations. Together with Council members Octavio Martinez and Fernando Dutra, we will be working collaboratively to address challenges and enhance the quality of life for our community. Finally, I'd like to thank outgoing Council member Jessica Martinez for her dedicated service over the last four years - she has been a great team member and we wish her the best in her future endeavors.

It's budget season at the City, which means there's much to consider as we review and analyze revenues, expenditures, and our priorities for the new fiscal year. The City Council and staff will participate in the annual budget study session during a special City Council meeting on Tuesday, May 7, 2024, which will be streamed live from the City's website and available for viewing on cable channel 3. The fiscal health of our city is of utmost importance, and although this year we are facing some challenges, we remain in a strong position as we kick off another budget cycle. Public safety continues to be our first priority. Thanks to past and current City Council's conservative oversight, as well as the passage of Measure W, the City has been able to continue offering the highest quality service and programming for our community. As always, the Council will be reviewing our programs, services, and operations to ensure efficiency and long-term sustainability and we will be keeping you updated over the next few months on how those funds are being utilized to benefit residents and their families.

As part of the current workplan, the Council continues to prioritize ongoing and future projects that align with our strategic goals related to public safety, financial stability, quality of life, maintaining a strong economic base, and enhancing transparency. In recent weeks, we've achieved some lofty goals including adoption of a Parks Master Plan which will help us assess and prioritize upgrades and improvements at our green spaces; we added new state-of-the-art lighting to the Murphy Ranch Little League fields just in time for the summer baseball season; we finished infrastructure projects including paving heavily traveled Santa Gertrudes Rd. and starting construction on the \$5M Murphy Reservoir Project; and awarded \$186,000 to local social services agencies helping Whittier residents with a variety of needs. Similarly, things to look forward to in the coming months include more park improvements at Kennedy and Broadway Parks, selection of a design for a new 2.14-acre park at First Ave. off the Greenway Trail, and a ribbon cutting for the new pickleball courts at Leffingwell Park; necessary paving of Palm Avenue between Beverly Blvd. and Whittier Blvd.; critical upgrades to Fire Station 17; and the official unveiling of the City's new brand including enhanced gateway monuments and refreshed signage throughout town later this summer. Investment in streetscape beautification and a

walkable, family-friendly promenade along Greenleaf remains a top priority, as is all the other exciting developments happening in Uptown Whittier like the Alpha Beta project on Comstock Ave. and proposed enhancements to King Richard's just down the street, not to mention the much-anticipated opening of Rodeo 72 at The Groves. There's no slowing down now!

As a reminder, I invite all of our local military personnel and veterans to join the City for our annual Memorial Day ceremony at City Hall on Monday, May 27 at 9:00 a.m. Come salute our servicemembers with honorable presentations and hear remarks from City Council members, locals veterans groups, and others. Families are invited to commemorate the national holiday together in front of the Civic Center and thank those men and women who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom. I encourage everyone to bring their children to learn that freedom isn't free.

Finally, I want to thank the Parks, Recreation & Community Services team, as well as the dedicated staff at the Whittier Public Library, for the work they are doing to prepare for a lively and engaging summer season. Both departments have a wide variety of interactive events and programs to enjoy like "Read to a Dog," Stay & Play Storytime, and Rec 'N Read at rotating parks, as well as day camps, our popular VolunTEENs program, and our movies and concerts in the park series, just around the corner. 



Your Medicare Shop Around the Corner Medicare Supplement (aka Medi-Gap) Plans and Prescription Drug Plans (PDP's)

Did you know you can switch your Medicare Supplement (Medi-Gap) Plan at any time? You may have read or seen this phrase somewhere or had a casual conversation with friends or colleagues. To add clarity to this topic or understand why you may want to change to another carrier, here are a few reasons why:

- Medical Supplement (Medi-Gap) Plans are filed with the Department of Insurance the exact same way and the coverages are identical.
- Therefore, we are looking at the "price" and the "carrier's name".
- As market rates increase, we make it a practice to market our clients' plans every year ensuring they are getting the best "value" for the same plan in this scenario, the main components in underwriting are age and zip code.

The process is simple:

- Meet with your trusted advisor, fill out an application (which includes health questions, and submit it to different carriers for consideration.
- The carrier's underwriter will process the application and can come to one of two outcomes: an approval or a declination.
- Most reasons for a decline are due to health issues.

However, California is one of the states that has a "birthday rule" for Medicare Supplement (Medi-Gap) Plans. This means you may submit an application during your birthday month window and be "guaranteed issued" (GI). Your plan would have to be a lateral or downgrade from your previous plan with most carriers. It's a very simple process since you will be GI - no health questions need to be filled out.

Maintenance is important and keeping costs down is getting harder to do in our environment; I call it "getting your house in order". It may seem like a lot of work, but most clients we talk to appreciate they went through this simple process, especially when they can save a great deal of premium on their plan.

Prescription Drug Plans (PDP's) follow a different set of rules and everyone shares the same window of opportunity to evaluate and make changes to their plan during the Annual Election Period (AEP) October 15th - December 7th for a January 1 effective date.

If you missed this window, there may be an opportunity to change your plan if you fall under a Medicare rule and a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has declared a certain disaster in your area. Reach out to your advisor and have a discussion.

If you do not have an advisor and would like to evaluate your plans, visit our Medicare Enrollment Resource Center located in the red brick building in Uptown Whittier right under the Social Security Building. 

Email: The Good, the Bad and the Scary

Ever wonder why so much attention is paid to phishing emails and how to recognize them in your security awareness training program? For those who are confused, wondering what a security awareness training program is, hang in there for a moment. That will be addressed shortly.

Phishing is still the preferred method for criminals to attack your business. It seems a couple of aspects of email make it so preferrable. First, email addresses are readily available. We all use email for so many things it feels ridiculous to keep our email addresses secret. Second, email generally relies on human interaction. More than 90% of security incidents are the result of human error.

In spite of the potential dangers of email, it doesn't seem like we are going to stop using it any time soon. That would be a little like not driving because you're scared of being involved in a collision. Just like checking your blind spots before changing lanes, there are things you can do to reduce the risk of using email. Following are three red flags that an email message could be malicious:

Unsolicited: Is someone you don't know initiating the conversation?

Urgency: Is there pressure to act rapidly, if not immediately?

Clicking: Is there a request to click a link, open attachments or download something? Taken individually, none of these three absolutely means an email is malicious. There are plenty of legitimate reasons to send an unsolicited email. Some circumstances are urgent, requiring quick action to be taken. Sometimes the best way to send a link or deliver a file is through email.

However, the combination of all three should certainly raise your guard. Of course, the challenge is that often we have too much going on to properly scrutinize our inboxes. The criminals are counting on this. We only have so much capacity for making decisions. We are all vulnerable when that capacity is running low.

Back to that security awareness training program...or maybe lack thereof. A good program will help you develop an unconscious competence regarding security, so that you don't have to stop and think about whether an email is potentially malicious. You will automatically recognize the red flags and take the appropriate action. The only way to reach that level is with regular, ongoing training. The annual training that satisfies the minimum industry compliance is not enough.






